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SHOULD I DROP THIS COURSE?

Unfortunately, the answer to this isn't a simple "yes" or "no". There are many things that may be impacted if you decide to drop a course. See below for things to consider and use the worksheet to guide your decision-making process.

What to Consider Before Dropping a Course

Academic Deadlines

- a. These are dates to add or drop a course without academic penalty
- b. If you drop your course by this deadline, the course will not show up on your transcript
- c. You can find these deadlines at <u>https://humber.ca/admissions/office-of-the-registrar/academic-calendar.html</u>
 - Look for "Last Day to Add a Course" and "Last Day to Withdraw From a Course Without Academic Penalty".

Financial Deadlines

- a. These are dates to add or drop courses, programs and cancel registration to receive a full or partial refund.
- b. If you miss this deadline, you will not receive a refund.
- c. You can find these deadlines at <u>https://humber.ca/admissions/office-of-the-registrar/academic-calendar.html</u>
 - Look for "Last Day to Drop a Course for Refund".

OSAP

- a. If you drop below 60% of your program course load per semester, you will become a part-time student, which will impact your financial aid from OSAP.
- b. Speak to Financial Aid Services prior to dropping a course.
 - Email <u>finaid@humber.ca</u> to receive a response in 5-10 days.





Length of Time to Graduate/Timing of Course Offerings

- a. Dropping a course may lengthen the time it takes to complete your program.
- b. A student must complete the program they are enrolled in within 200% of the normal program duration. For example, if your program is 4 semesters long, you have 8 semesters to complete it.
- c. Many courses are only offered once per year. If you drop the course, you will need to check when it will be offered next. For example, if you plan to complete your program by the end of this summer, but the course is only available in the next Winter semester, you will have to wait an entire year just to take that one course to graduate.
