"[Institutional] culture represents the shared beliefs, values, customs, and traditions that impact our actions and interactions. We cannot simply declare an institutional culture. It needs to be cultivated, shaped, and maintained by leadership with a visionary outlook and strategic mindset" (Black, 2010, p. 126).


A positive transfer culture is an increasingly important element of a culture of student success.

 - Good students
 - Backfill for attrition
 - Richer classroom experiences
- For the sending institution:
 - Give students a reason to pick your institution
 - Demonstrate credibility of credentials







Goals:

What is TAG? (Transfer Advisor Group)

How do we do this?

- Mentoring program for new transfer advisors
- An online communication hub (Facebook Workplace Standard)
- •In-person events where we can network, build individual capacity, and share promising practices happening at our institutions
- •Other virtual and online knowledge sharing activities to hone our skills and learn from each other





TAG: Next Steps

The key takeaways from the meeting include:

- 1. TAG will transition into regional based multi-staff events/workshops
- 2. An annual central professional development event will be held (an evolution of TAG and ONtransfer.ca Day)
- 3. Those in leadership and management positions will form a Heads of Transfer and Articulation Committee (HOTA) to discuss specific topics impacting institutional transfer offices
- 4. An RFP for a consultant will go out to help us think through the development and potential methodologies of a sustainable transfer education program
- 5. Continue to offer knowledge mobilization activities



Resources for Advising Transfer Students



RECOMMEND TRANSFER CREDIT	YES?
Has the student previously taken a postsecondary course (at a recognized institution) with similar learning outcomes to a course in their current program?	
Does the course meet the currency requirement? (core courses: 5 years; electives, english and math courses: 10 years)	
Does the course meet the minimum grade requirement? Transfer to the same level or lower credential = min. 60%, transfer from diploma to degree = min. 65%	
If yes to all, apply for transfer credit at humber.ca/transferoptions. Please note: Residency requirement is 25% - Students can receive transfer credit for up to 75% of their courses.	
RECOMMEND PLAR (PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT & RECOGNITION)	YES?
Does the student have prior work, volunteer or informal experience in a related field?	
Do the knowledge, skills and abilities gained from this experience match the learning outcomes of the course they want to be exempt from?	
Is the student able to demonstrate the learning acquired, as opposed to experience (i.e. development of a learning portfolio or challenge exam)?	
If yes, student should go see their program coordinator to discuss the PLAR process and submission of either a learning portfolio or a challenge exam. The PLAR application can be found at humber.ca/transferoptions.	
Please note: If a student is applying for elective credit they can only receive PLAR credit through passing a challenge exam.	
RECOMMEND A PATHWAY	YES?
Has the student completed a diploma at a recognized postsecondary institution in Ontario where the learning outcomes are similar to the Humber diploma? (i.e. same MTCU code)	
Is the overall GPA in the diploma program 65% or above? (This is a minimum requirement and does not gurantee admissions. Some degrees may also have specific subject course requirements. Check the Pathway section of the program page)	
Is the student interested in a work placement opportunity?
