

"Yes. He was. I mean, he was like ..."



 First Year Experience Framework




"His Five Senses (capability, connectedness, purpose, resourcefulness, and academic culture) provide both a framework and a set of outcomes that are focused, intentional, and practical in both curricular and co-curricular development. Transition pedagogy is crucial to developing a holistic approach in first year experience initiatives; it is defined by Kift as "a guiding philosophy for intentional first year curriculum design that carefully scaffolds and mediates the first year learning experience for contemporary heterogeneous cohorts" (Kift, 2008, pg. 5). Our first year experience framework includes Lizzio's Senses as a deliberate model for a well-rounded approach to developing social and academic supports for new students as they enter York and progress through their first year."

The 'Five-Senses' of Student Success

(Lizzio, 2006)





The 5 Senses

Capability – depends on how well they understand what is expected of them

Connectedness- depends on the quality of relationships with peers, staff, and identifying with the school

Purpose – depends on their vocation, engagement with their discipline of study, and capacity to set goals

Resourcefulness – depends on their ability to navigate the school's systems, getting help and information, and find balance in their school, life and work commitments

Academic Culture – depends on appreciation of values and principles of the institution, and how this informs their relationships with others in their role as a student

Student to Student Relationships	~	?	X	-
Quality of personal networks: Help me to make personal connections with other students (e.g., hosting social activities, introduce yourself to the person besides/behind in lectures, relationship programs (e.g., 'meet 3 new people each week))				
Purposeful co-operation: Help me to develop effective working relationships with fellow students in my courses (e.g., group formation/team building activities in tutorials, undertaking cooperative projects, describe fellow students as colleagues)				
Valuing of diversity: Help me 'appreciate differences' in my interactions with other students (e.g., structured sharing of stories/experiences across age group, gender, culture, race, relate to Student Charter and to values of personal and intellectual respect)				
Sense of solidarity: Help me feel a sense of membership of my student cohort (e.g., encourage/fund student associations)				
Access to experience: Help me to get to know and learn from the experience and modelling of senior students (e.g., peer mentoring, peer tutoring, cross-year social events)				
Encouraging peer support: Help me to give/receive help and support				r

- First ever Career Week hosted in Fall 2019, in place of a campus wide job fair
- Focus on career skill development, prior to job fairs hosted by faculties
- Winter 2020, 2 days (one at each campus), ~400 attended
- 92% of students would recommend the event to other students
- 89% said they feel more prepared to take steps in their career to achieve goals
